Aim: We are running a brief pilot course specifically aimed at people who have

considerable pastoral experience and who may already in effect be acting as spiritual directors but have not had any formal training. There is an application process and potential participants need to have been seeing a spiritual director themselves for a minimum of 2 years. In the longer term we still envisage the possibility of a 2-year

course but there would be a cost involved for those participating.)

Content: 6 day-long sessions plus attendance at 2 other days which will be open to all spiritual

directors on the Diocesan List (one of which will be on supervision). Each of the 6 sessions starts with a Eucharistic service (voluntary attendance), a prayer exercise, then input to encourage learning and discussion about various aspects of spirituality and spiritual direction, practical working in threes, a supervision, practical matters relating to spiritual direction, and the Examen. Discussion and questions are

encouraged. The course is developing and is being designed to take into account the

needs of this particular cohort.

on the interpretative principles derived from Carmelite spirituality, to deepen the understanding of one's experiences in the journey towards intimacy with God. The model is distinctive as its emphasis is not only in having Carmelite spirituality as its foundation but in its aim to prepare candidates to undertake spiritual direction both on a one to one or group basis but as importantly, to be a guiding and prayerful presence in the world. The course may also enhance the ability of spiritual directors who currently hold accredited qualifications or experience in other traditions of Spiritual direction or formation. A Certificate in The Art of Spiritual Direction

Carmelite Tradition) will be awarded at the end of the programme.

## Course in retreat giving and spiritual direction guidance

(Such recommendations are given at the end of the ISA course rather than at a later date.) In some circumstances it may be possible to attend this course without having attended ISA if there is significant prior training and previous experience.

Participants should also have made the full Spiritual Exercises of Ignatius Loyola, having done this as a retreat in daily life (19<sup>th</sup> annotation), or residentially as a 30-day retreat

## Understanding the Spiritual Exercises

Aims:

This workshop is aimed at spiritual directors who have made the Exercises themselves and wish to deepen their understanding of the text and dynamic of the Exercises.

One focus of the workshop will be the ways in which we use the Exercises in various spiritual accompaniment contexts. As well as input from the team, there will be some reading and seminar-style discussion.
